Boys & Girls Clubs in New Hampshire serve over 28,268 youth each year

Our Scope of Service

- 9 Boys & Girls Club corporations in New Hampshire
- 9 Cities in New Hampshire have at least one Boys & Girls Club
- 11 Club Sites in New Hampshire
- Average attendance in New Hampshire Clubs is 2,016 young people per day

Where We are Located

- 27% of club sites are located in urban communities, 27% are located in rural communities and 36% are located in suburban communities
- 1 Military Installation has at least one Boys & Girls Club facility

Who We Serve

- 44% Females, 56% Males
- 6% African-American, 3% Asian, 70% Caucasian, 1% Native American, 4% Multi-Racial, and 12% Hispanic
- 5% age 5 and under, 44% age 6-10, 23% age 11-12, 22% age 13-15, and 6% age 16 and over

Who Provides the Leadership

- 77 full time and 204 part time employees provide the program services and management of the Boys & Girls Club organizations
- 812 volunteers assist in providing program services to youth
- 167 additional volunteers assist in providing management, administrative or general organizational support
